

## Introduction

This is a basic outline of the processes used when a Player wishes to move from one Club to another Club during a calendar year or were last registered with an overseas Club.

All registrations and transfers are processed in accordance with Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) Statutes and Football Federation Australia (FFA) Regulations in association with Zone Rules and Regulations. Where there are inconsistencies then FIFA and/or FFA Statutes/Regulations take precedence.

Any questions regarding registrations or transfers should be referred to the Operations Manager or Chief Executive Officer of the Football Federation Northern Territory (FFNT).

## Can an Amateur Player Move to Another Club?

Yes. If an amateur Player has been registered for any other Australian Club during the same calendar year and they wish to register with another Club they need to:

1. Complete a 'Cancellation of Amateur Registration' form and have their old Club sign that form.
2. Complete a 'Supplementary Registration' form to register with their new Club.

Note that a Player can register with a maximum of three (3) Clubs during a calendar year and only Play with two (2) Clubs during that period.

Amateur Player's registration ends after the last game of their season.

## Overseas Transfer

1. When a Club wishes to register a Player who is currently or previously registered with an overseas Club the following must be lodged with their local Zone:
  - FFA Registration Form - fully completed and signed;
  - Copy of the Player's personal details on passport (clear copy);
  - Copy of the date of entry into Australia on the appropriate passport page;
  - Electronic copy of the visa;
  - Previous residential address in the country where they were/are registered;
  - Previous overseas Club details (name and location);
  - For professional players only a copy of the player's contract.
2. Players who are from countries where Australia does not have reciprocal Medicare arrangements will need to provide documentary proof of appropriate levels of insurance cover.
3. The Zone forwards the documentation to FFNT who requests an International Transfer Certificate from FFA.
4. FFA then applies to the relevant international Association for an ITC.  
If the request is successful, FFA will forward a copy of the ITC to FFNT.
5. FFNT will advise the Zone of the outcome of the request and the Player will be registered if the ITC is received.

Note that Players are not eligible to play in any competition fixture until an ITC has been received from FFA.
